

Call me, email, text, or hail on channel 16.
- We will raft up or anchor separately depending on weather conditions and willingness of each skipper to raft (please share dinghy rides with other members when necessary).
- We will plan short happy hours on most raft up evenings, but we often try to have a pot luck dinner at least one evening during the long cruises. Host boat volunteers will be accepted the week prior to each cruise. Healthy snacks are requested, and we may occasionally elect to limit the cocktail hour to beverages only and one hour only - in honor of our growing waistlines, acid reflux, and the fact that we have all heard everyone else's sea stories at least once per trip already.
- When we cruise with another club, each CSC member should make an effort to raft with, or snack with at least one member of the other organization to make them feel welcome.
